### THINGS TO DO AROUND DARWIN

For those not attending the conference sessions on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 12<sup>th</sup>, there are lots to see and do that are close to the Alatai Holiday Apartments.

Some of the more popular venues include:

**Parap Markets** - Stalls offer a huge variety of fresh produce, Asian foods, freshly brewed coffees, exotic flowers, and local arts and crafts

Saturdays from 8am to 2pm at Parap Shopping Village, Parap Rd

**Aquascene** - Hundreds of fish come to shore at high tide to be fed by hand. Check the day's feeding times in local publications, hotels or by visiting the website at [www.aquascene.com.au](http://www.aquascene.com.au)

**Darwin Wharf Precinct, Australian Pearling Exhibition & Indo Pacific Marine** - Enjoy a coffee or meal at alfresco eateries, gain an informative insight into the pearling industry in northern Australian waters or visit Darwin's only living marine environment centre.

**Museum & Art Gallery of the NT** - Features collections of the region's art, natural science, history and culture, Aboriginal art and culture, arts and craft from south-east Asia and Pacific regions, maritime archaeology and Northern Territory history. The museum also houses a Cyclone Tracy exhibit and the chance to meet Sweetheart, the Top End's most famous crocodile.

There are also a number of places to visit if you are interested in the history of the NT. These include **Burnett House**, a heritage-listed National Trust property and an excellent example of early tropical architecture, **Fannie Bay Gaol**, which opened in 1883 and was the major detention centre in Darwin for almost 100 years, **Lyons Cottage**, built in 1925 houses a fascinating collection of photographs and artefacts depicting the early history of Darwin.

There are also a variety of places that tell of the bombing of Darwin, including the **WWII Oil Storage Tunnels** - there are two tunnels open for viewing featuring a collection of photographs of Darwin and the men and women that served here during the war, The **Darwin Military Museum**, which has a large exhibit of items from the war, including Navy, Army and Air Force items from Australian, US and other armed forces and the **Survivors Lookout**, which shows where ships were sunk in Darwin harbour and tells of the over 64 air raids that took place.

We hope you have fun exploring Darwin.
